

Over the past 30 years, New York City's McFadden's Restaurant & Saloon has become a chain in nearly every major eastern city stretching from Boston to Chicago and down to Nashville. In January, McFadden's opened its 11th location in Las Vegas at the Rio, elbowing into the now-defunct Dragon Bar space next door to create a **7,000-square-foot mega-pub equipped with more than 15 50-inch high-definition plasma televisions and a mind-numbingly expansive 100-foot-long bar top.** According to manager Gina Groh, the space was designed to represent a turn of the century "Olde New York" tavern with mahogany woodwork accented by modern chrome fixtures.

It's rumored Mr. 12-incher himself, Ron Jeremy—the transgenerational champion of horny young lads the world over—is great buddies with the chain's owners. He made an appearance early in January at the new McFadden's. **Following Jeremy, expect to find plenty of celebrities of a certain caliber popping up from time to time,** like Irish punk rockers Flogging Molly March 15 from 1-3 p.m. Resident DJs will play on certain nights of the week, laying down Top 40, '80s and '90s dance tracks. There will be no shortage of frisky, young co-eds dancing on table tops, hands on the hips of the person in front of them.

McFadden's is open daily from 11 to 4 a.m. and offers a full menu for lunch and dinner, including such Irish favorites as shepherd's pie and such genetically modified American favorites as boneless Buffalo wings. Other menu items range from chicken fingers, burgers and fish & chips to a pan-seared halibut and goat cheese salad.

Accustomed to hosting bachelor and bachelorette parties, birthdays, rehearsal dinners and luncheons, McFadden's can accommodate groups of up to 500 people. Plus, there's no dress code enforced.

"You can come dressed to the nines or in jeans and flip-flops and everyone fits in," Groh said. CP
